

Pumpkin Pie Crunch

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 F degrees.

Grease the bottom of a 9x13 inch baking pan.

Combine pumpkin, evaporated milk, eggs, sugar and pumpkin pie spice in a large bowl until smooth.

Pour into the prepared baking pan.

With a fork, mix dry cake mix, pecans and melted butter. Sprinkle evenly over pumpkin mixture.

Bake for 50 to 55 minutes or until golden. Let it cool completely, then enjoy!

Refrigerate any leftovers

Ingredients

1 yellow cake mix

1 can (16 ounces) pumpkin puree

1 can (12 ounces) evaporated milk

3 large eggs

3/4 cup sugar

2 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice

1 cup chopped pecan

1 cup melted butter

Fall maintenance goes well beyond the boundaries of your garden. October and November are great times to take care of other maintenance and landscape design projects such as:

- Install new or expand existing deck.
- Install or repair irrigation system.
- Add outdoor lighting for entertaining and safety.
- Add a water feature to garden.
- Repair or install fencing.
- Winterize irrigation system and protect outdoor faucets.
- Repair any drainage issues.
- Clean and pressure wash walkways and driveways.
- Check gutters and downspouts.
- Fertilize and aerate your lawn to prepare for next year
- Overseed the lawn and attack perennial weeds
